

Eureka! Treasure Hunters Membership Handbook Excerpts

General Requirements of a Member

Members are required to abide by the Treasure Hunter's Code of Ethics and Bylaws of the club.

Members should attend as many meetings and outings as possible.

Members should be willing to serve on a committee if asked.

Members are encouraged to participate in events.

Members are encouraged to promote fellowship within the club, with other organizations of similar interests and with the community.

Members, if eligible, are encouraged to run for any elective office.

Members in violation of the Club's bylaws are subject to disciplinary action, as determined by the Executive Board.

Board of Directors

- 1. Board members, along with the other officers of the Club, shall comprise an Executive Board which shall aid in Club policy-making decisions.
- 2. The Board of Directors shall represent the Club when dealing with community agencies or other Clubs with mutual interest.

- 3. The Board of Directors shall be an extension of the President and Vice-President.
- The Board of Directors shall be called in on all special meetings called by the President.

Board Meeting

- 1. Any Executive Board member who misses three (3) Board meetings in succession may be removed from that position at the discretion of the Board.
- 2. A special election may be held at the next general membership meeting to elect and fill any vacant position.

Upcoming elections

We will be taking nominations for 4 seats on the Board of directors during the upcoming December meeting. By being a board member you can be on the front lines of what is going on with the club and affect the future direction of the club. Being a board member does not take a lot of time unless you wish to be more involved in the hobby. Just like anything else, the more you put into it, the more you get out of it.

Colorado's Hidden Gems By Linda Erickson

After visiting a local museum recently, I thought it might be interesting to do a column for the newsletter on some of Colorado's hidden gems (small museums, shops, etc.) that relate to our hobby. I can't promise a column every month, but thought when I come across some of these places, I would share them with you. This first hidden gem has to do with money and since we all like to find money, I thought it might fit the bill.

This past week provided me with a couple of days to get out downtown on my lunch hour and enjoy the nice weather. I had seen a big sign posted along the side of the Federal Reserve Bank advertising their Money Museum and I thought it would make a nice lunch hour adventure. The Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas City -Denver Branch offers a unique and upclose look at the nation's financial system. After locating the entrance off of Curtis Street, I proceeded through the security check (photo ID required), through the small courtyard and into the bank. To the left of the desk in the entry you will find various informational displays. There is a small room where a short video presentation is shown explaining the Federal Reserve System, banking and the economy. Some of the highlights include viewing \$30 million dollars, examining historical currency, exploring the interactive displays, including one about counterfeit notes, and an area where you can design your own currency (fun for the younger crowd). Self guided visitors are welcome from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, excluding bank holidays.



No reservations are necessary for the selfguided tour and all ages and groups sizes are accepted. If you are a teacher, they also offer guided tours for fifth grade level groups and above and there are additional resources for educators and students. Those tours are offered at 9:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. Visit www.kansascityfed.org/ moneymuseum to find out specific information about booking a group tour. I was through the self-guided tour in half an hour so if you are downtown with some time to spare, check it out. The best part-it's free, and they send you home with a bag of money. Be sure to pick it up on your way out.





In-Town Hunt Schedule

If this sounds familiar, the rules regarding in-town hunts bear repeating. Again, I want to reiterate in-town hunt rules for those who seem to have missed the obvious by failing to read and follow the instructions the club has provided. We want you to put on hunts. They are designed to be fun, first and foremost. They provide a context outside of the meetings for fellowship with club members. To put on an in-town hunt you MUST:

- Schedule with the Huntmaster.
- > Provide a plan.
- Provide flyers.
- Ensure the hunt rules are discussed BEFORE the hunt.
- Police the hunt.
- The hunt master for any particular hunt can decide open hunt (non-members may hunt) or members only.
- Write a story for the newsletter and send it and accompanying photos to the newsletter editor prior to that month's deadline.

To ensure the continuation of this hobby and to provide the best impression of Eureka! and its membership, you, as hunt master, MUST enforce all rules, including:

1. Pouches to store finds and trash MUST be worn and used at all times during the hunt.

- 2. All hunters must wear headphones.
- 3. Absolutely no tolerance of holes left open. A first warning, followed by a time-out or expulsion from the hunt, will usually get people's attention
- 4. Hunters digging and leaving trash on the hunt field should re ceive the same treatment dis cussed above.

All hunts will need to be okayed by Huntmaster (Roy Neys) prior to officially being put in the newsletter and put on.

Failure to follow the guidelines may result in hunts being cancelled.


